Abstract:

Skin is the largest organ in the human body. It is the most exposed organ to environment and forms the first layer of defense. Aetiopathogenesis of skin disorders is multifactorial and environmental factors play a key role in triggering or aggravating several diseases. Global warming and climate changes have an impact on skin disorders too. Environmental factors like UV rays, water, cold, dust, pollution and pollens influence the course of several dermatological conditions like eczema, psoriasis, skin ageing and skin cancers. Measures to prevent several of these conditions provoked by the environment will be discussed in the presentation.
